OPENING REGULAR MEETING

Chairman Stan Helton called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM

Doss said that as to Magistrate Court and Probate Court it had never signed the contract in prior meetings. Commissioner Johnson commented that only the Board of Commissioners could sign contracts. Chairman Helton asked if it would be proper for the courts to ask for bids or the Board of Commissioners and noted if the board took bids it would likely need to be in unison with Pickens County and Gilmer County. Judge Kiker deferred to the County Attorney and asked that the record Sosebee added that if Judge Kiker had no issue with it then he did not either. Commissioner Johnson remarked that if the judges were happy with it he approved of the contract but did not understand why they had never signed the contract in prior meetings. Commissioner Johnson commented that only the Board of Scott Kiker commented on the contract and stated the same company had been used since he took office. Judge Kiker stated he had read the agreement but never questioned it. Commissioner Sosebee asked if the Sosebee made a motion to table the contract approval until the next meeting. Commiss remarked he would not want to go against the Probate Judge and Magistrate Judge's wishes. tabling the motion and confirming it would not delay the Magistrate Judge or Probate Judge.
