

Fannin County Board of Commissioners Regular Meeting Jury Assembly Room July 25, 2018 at 5:15pm

OPENING REGULAR MEETING

Chairman Helton called the meeting to order at 5:15pm.

The invocation was said, and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Commissioner Johnson Sosebee made a second. Motion passed unanimously Chairman Helton made a motion to appoint Lynn Doss to take minutes for the meeting. Commissioner

SPECIAL RECOGNITIONS & APPOINTMENTS

Kathy Henson representing the Division of Family and Children Services asked Tara Cantrell to be appointed to represent the Fannin school system for 5 years on the DFCS board, that Bob Welch be appointed to the DFCS board to represent the religious community for 5 more years, and that Darrell Payne to be appointed to the DFCS board to represent EMS for 5 years. NEW BUSINESS

Ed Hawkins made a report to the commissioners that the old jail roof was leaking and needed repair. Mr. Hawkins presented estimates from two companies for the proposed work. M.B. Woodworking quoted \$15,950 for metal roofing and \$12,950 for shingles. JD Construction quoted \$12,840 for metal roofing and \$12,300 for shingles. Motion made by Chairman Helton to use metal roofing from JD Construction. Second by Commissioner Sosebee. Motion passed unanimously.

Christi Arp with the Development Authority presented 2 board appointments. Ms. Arp recommended Darren Danner to represent the school system and Frankie Rigdon to represent ETC on the Development Authority Board each for 3 years. Motion made by Chairman Helton. Second made by Commissioner Johnson. Ms. Arp also reported that TVA would double its investment on citizen friendly dam improvements to \$100,000. Ms. Arp also reported that the Forest Service Lakewood Landing would have the 27 parking spots expanded twofold and repaving of the existing lot along with minor maintenance of the surrounding facilities.

the road to emergency services arry Thomas addressed the board with concerns about the condition of Joy Drive and the accessibility of

Chairman Helton proposed the new road to the left and behind the new fire station, Station Ridge, be taken over as a county road. He also proposed that Village Road, starting by Ingles and leading up the hill approximately ½ mile toward Blue Ridge Village be taken over as a county road. Chairman Helton cited 123 EMS calls in the past year between Riverstone and Blue Ridge Village.

Discussion on Joy Drive, Station Ridge, and Village Road included:

Chairman Helton stated that ¼ mile of Joy Drive would need to be scraped and graveled.

Chairman Helton said that Station Ridge and Village Road would not require immediate action.

Commissioner Johnson concurred that Joy Drive was "a disaster" and that Station Ridge and Village Road were both necessary to incorporate into the county purview.



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
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
