



FANNIN COUNTY SPEED ZONE ORDINANCE

Pursuant to the Georgia Uniform Rules of the road as amended, Title 40, Chapter 6, Code Section 40-6-81 through 40-6-183 and Code Sections 40-6-370 through 40-6-376, and Chapter 14, Code Sections 40-14-1 through 40-14-16 where applicable are hereby adopted as and for the traffic regulations of Fannin County with the like effective as if recited herein.

Be it ordained by the Fannin County Board of Commissioners, that the following speed zones are hereby established based upon an engineering and traffic investigation as prescribed by law:

On the Fannin County System

MOBILE ROAD (CR 167)

Mobile Road running from the Tennessee State line to Macedonia Church Road (CR177) for a distance of 3.9 miles. The speed limit shall be 55 miles per hour.

MADOLA ROAD (CR212)

Madola Road running from Church Street (CR155) to Fightingtown Creek Bridge for a distance of 2.7 miles. The speed limit shall be 45 miles per hour.

ASKA ROAD (CR 222)

Aska Road running from Old Highway 76 for a distance of 1.7 miles. The speed limit shall be 45 miles per hour.

Aska Road running from Old Hwy 76 between 1.7 miles and 7.1 miles. The speed limit shall be 55 miles per hour.

Aska Road running from Old Hwy 76 between 7.1 miles to 9.0 miles. The speed limit shall be 45 miles per hour.

Aska Road running from Old Hwy 76 between 9.0 miles and 11.1 miles. The Speed limit shall be 55 miles per hour.

Aska Road running from 11.1 miles to Newport Road (CR 8). The speed limit shall be 45 miles per hour.

NEWPORT ROAD (CR 8)

Newport Road running from Doublehead Gap Road (CR 218 to Dial Road (CR 5) for a distance of 4.7 miles. The speed limit shall be 45 miles per hour.

DOUBLEHEAD GAP ROAD (CR 218)

Doublehead Gap Road running from the Gilmer County line to Noontootla Creek Bridge for a distance of 1.7 miles. The speed limit shall be 45 miles per hour.

LOVING ROAD (CR 220)

Loving Road running from the Union County line to State Highway 55 for a distance of 5.1 miles. The speed limit shall be 45 miles per hour.

HARDSCRABBLE ROAD (CR 78,80, 82,83)

Hardscrabble Road running from State Highway 60 to State Highway Spur 60 for a distance of 7.3 miles. The speed limit will be 45 miles per hour.

SCENIC DRIVE (CR 217)

Scenic Drive running from the Blue Ridge City limits to State Highway 5 for a distance of 2.5 miles. The speed limit shall be 40 miles per hour.

CHESTNUT GAP ROAD (CR 215)

Chestnut Gap Road running from Old Highway 2 to Sugar Creek Rod (CR 217) for a distance of 3.8 miles. The speed limit shall be 40 miles per hour.

SUGAR CREEK ROAD (CR 217)

Sugar Creek Road running from Gilmer County line to Chestnut Gap Road (CR 215) for a distance of 2.5 miles. The speed limit shall be 55 miles per hour.

Sugar Creek Road running from Chestnut Gap Road (CR 215) to Scenic Drive (CR 217) for a distance of 1.5 miles. The speed limit shall be 45 miles per hour.

LEBANON CHURCH ROAD (CR 219)

Lebanon Church Road running from Madola Road (CR 212) to Old Highway 2 for a distance of 3.5 miles. The speed limit shall be 45 miles per hour.

OLD HWY 2

Old Highway 2 running from State Highway 5 for a distance of 9 miles. The speed limit shall be 45 miles per hour.

TENNIS COURT ROAD (CR 118)

Tennis Court Road running from Old Highway 2 to Sugar Creek Road (CR 217) for a distance of 2.3 miles. The speed limit shall be 40 miles per hour.

MOUNTAIN VIEW ROAD (CR177,178, 179)

Mountain View Road sunning from Mobile Road (CR 167) to Macedonia Church Road a distance of 3.4 miles. The speed limit shall be 40 miles per hour.

ADA STREET (CR 103)

Ada Street running from the Blue Ridge City limits to Curtis Switch Road (CR 195) FOR A DISTANCE OF 3.4 MILES. The speed limit shall be 40 miles per hour.

GALLOWAY ROAD (CR 195)

Galloway Road running from Ada Street (CR 103) to State Highway 5 for a distance of 3.2 miles. The speed limit shall be 35 miles per hour.

MINERAL SPRINGS ROAD (CR 268)

Mineral Springs Road running from Aska Road (CR 222) to the Blue Ridge City limits (Church Street) for a distance of 1 mile. The speed limit shall be 40 miles per hour.

This ordinance was approved by the Fannin County Board of Commissioners, after required notice, public hearings, publication of agenda and a majority vote in favor of adoption on February 13, 2024. Each ordinance is effective upon adoption.
